Caroline Wright

Caroline joined BESA in 2012, becoming Director General role in 2016. She represents BESA on a range of Government and sector advisory boards including the Department for International Trade's Education Sector Advisory Group. She has held a range of positions sharing insights and expertise on the UK education suppliers sector including Co-Chair of the DfE EdTech Leadership Group, the Worlddidac Council, and Education Investor Advisory Board and Trustee of the Education Media Centre.



Christine Major

Christine is a senior EdTech exec with over 20 years' experience working with start-ups through to global Corps. She has cultivated partnerships with education stakeholders at all levels from Presidential Council members and MoEs through to B2B partners and classroom teachers alike, working closely to create and deliver groundbreaking EdTech+ and professional development solutions that support their strategic goals.

Head of Epsom College since February 2023, he was Vice-Chancellor of the University of Buckingham from 2015 to 2020 after being a transformative head for 20 years of Brighton College and then Wellington College.



He is author or editor of over 45 books on contemporary history, including the inside books on the last six Prime Ministers, was the co-founder and first director of the Institute for Contemporary British History, is cofounder of Action for Happiness, was honorary historical adviser to 10 Downing Street for ten years, was the UK's Special Representative for Education to Saudi Arabia, was Deputy Chair of The Times Education Commission, was a member of the Government's First World War Culture Committee, was chair of the Comment Awards, is a director of the Royal Shakespeare Company, is the President of IPEN, (International Positive Education Network), is Chair of the National Archives Trust and is initiator and deputy chair of the "commission on the centre" run by the Institute for government.

He is patron or on the board of several charities, founder of the Via Sacra Western Front Walk, and was executive producer of the film Journey's End. He appeared on the Desert Island Discs in 2016. For the last fifteen years he has given his money from writing and lecturing to charity. He has three children; his wife of 34 years, Joanna, died of cancer in December 2016. He married Sarah in April 2022.

Jonathan Ledger

At Learning Curve Group, I am responsible for our growth into new markets such as International and also the Justice sector




Morgan Dee
